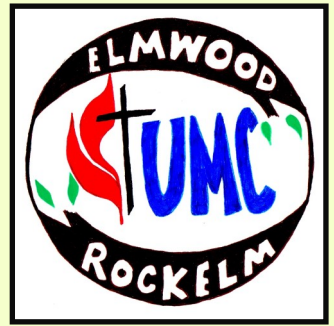
As followers of Jesus, we strive to live our daily lives as a reflection of that love. Through God's love and saving grace we are continually being made new! Praise God!

Weekly Devotional

The Message of The Cross by Ebenezer Insor

For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. 1 Corinthians 1:18

Beloved in Christ, I hope all is going well with your Lenten journey so far. Whatever our reflections have been so far, we are looking forward to a time of solemnity and the great celebration of our risen Christ. But before we get there, we have a river to cross, whose expanse cannot be overcome by our human strength or prowess. We will need a bridge to get to the other side and that bridge comes in the cross.

We as Christians are familiar with the cross and how much it means to us. It has become one of our marks of identity for what it stands for. We wear it aesthetically, hang them in our homes and churches. In fact, it is our GPS as we drive to cities looking for a church. So, what was the stigma about the Cross in Paul's time? It was an object of disgrace, shameful, despicable, deplorable, despised by society. Think about capital punishment in our day and age. From hanging, lynching, stoning, lethal injection, electric chair and firing squads. These can be likened to society's distaste and dislike for the cross.

In contrast to us, it is the message of salvation. The bridge which enabled us to get to the other side by God's grace and mercy. Why may you ask? Because he loved us so much that he gave us his begotten son, that whosoever believes in him will have eternal life. By what means could this happen? By becoming the propitiation for our sin as he carried our iniquities, infirmities, and transgressions, all the way to the cross and even death.

As He hung on the cross with the two other thieves, He bore our sins for us, and through the words on the cross will give that hope of salvation and eternity. For through those words, He echoed forgiveness for all of us, knowing that we have come short of God's glory. Then He offered salvation as He invited the thief into paradise with him. He encouraged relationships through caring for each other in connecting John and his mother Mary. The yearning and longing of our soul's thirst for living water. This often leads us to feel abandoned as he cries out feeling forgotten and forsaken. Then in exhaustion, see the suffering come to end. Finally is the reunion, which leads to the glorious hallelujahs committing His spirit in the Father's arms in eternal rest.

So beloved in Christ, remember to become faithful disciples, where we must deny ourselves and take up the cross and follow Him. As we journey through Lent, may we survey the wondrous cross on which the prince of glory died, as our richest gain, lifting it high to proclaim the love of the world to adore his sacred name.

Loving God, we thank you for your grace and mercy manifested on a hill far away, where an old rugged cross stood as the emblem of our suffering and shame. May we be reminded of the sacrifices made for our salvation on it by our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, that we may deny ourselves and take up our cross and follow our calling. Amen.

When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to any one, for they were afraid.

Peace and blessings of Christ Jesus be with you with the Easter Spirit! We are indeed a resurrected people!

Let us overcome the forces of darkness and death and celebrate with one another the grace of God, who has gifted us a new life and hope in Christ. Let us awaken again through resurrection and live an enlightened life where the world of all life is protected, and God's creation is regenerated through green ecological awareness. We are God's stewards of creation and accept all as sacred and worth preserving.

Furthermore, as members of the United Methodist Church, we must break down the walls of distrust, separation, and conflict, living out social holiness by loving one another and truly sharing the kin(g)dom of God, and become a community of life that lives out the identity of the church there.

May this Easter Season inspire us to live lives transformed by the power of Jesus' resurrection – boldly, courageously, lovingly, and faithfully.

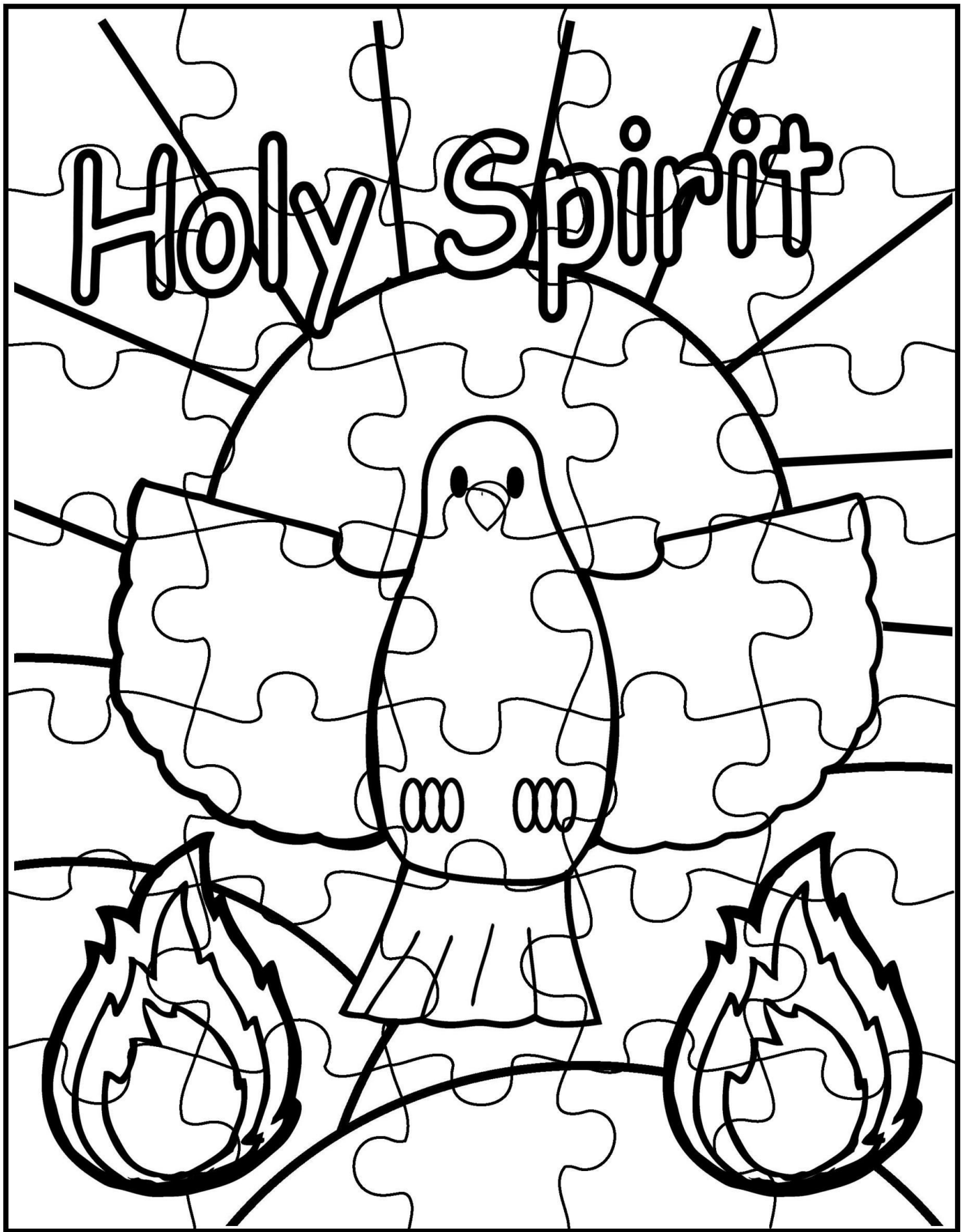
