This spring, I participated in various self-evaluations to better understand my family of origin, intercultural competence, and spiritual gifts. All these inventories and/or interviews indicated that I am task-oriented; this would not surprise those who know me. I genuinely value getting things done, moving on to the next project, and accomplishing the goal.

The Wisconsin Conference clergy gathered for our Annual School of Ministry this fall. Our speaker invited us to various centering, focusing, and mindfulness exercises. At first, I resisted. My to-do list was a mile long; I felt pressure to meet my role's demands and prove that I could do this. I did not want to focus on a picture, take some deep breaths, or talk about it all. I wanted to get back to work.


I reluctantly participated as we moved into a breathing exercise connecting our breath to the Creator of all. And so we began, breathe in 2, 3, 4; hold 2, 3, 4; breathe out 2, 3, 4, breathe in 2, 3, 4; hold 2, 3, 4; breathe out 2, 3, 4 and breathe in 2, 3, 4; hold 2, 3, 4; breathe out 2, 3, 4. As I inhaled, held my breath, and exhaled, a deep rhythm began, and my mind wandered for a bit, and a beautiful thing happened – I slowed down. I was in the moment. My body relaxed, and I felt a letting go. As we moved out of this exercise, I noted how I felt mentally, spiritually, and physically. I felt more connected to God and the person God has created me to be.

We will soon be entering a high-demand cultural and religious season of Christmas. There are high expectations of presents, cards, concerts, celebrations, parties, worship services, children's church programs, school programs, and so much more. Whether you are task-oriented or not, the demand will throw you off – and a significant moment in your Christian walk – the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ may become just another thing to do.

When you are feeling this way – take a moment or two, ground yourself in the power of God, who breathes life into you, loves you, invites you into stillness: breathe in 2, 3, 4; hold 2, 3, 4; breathe out 2, 3, 4, breathe in 2, 3, 4; hold 2, 3, 4; breathe out 2, 3, 4.






