Does My Prayer Matter? A Testimony

YES. I can offer you clear evidence that does. I can say that with much more clarity than anything I say in this ministry. Not only that, but I am writing to urge you to include prayer for your ecumenical neighbors in your personal prayers and in the petitions (sometimes called joys and concerns) of your church.

How do I know this? On the weekend of June 9-11, the Wisconsin Conference

of the United Church of Christ (UCC) gathered at Green Lake. The Wisconsin Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church (UMC) gathered in Green Bay. I knew I'd be missing my own UCC meeting to gather with the UMC as they faced a significant time of distress in their common life. I asked our Conference Minister if the gathered UCC members could pray for the UMC as they began their work.

Late Friday afternoon, the United Methodists took up the matter of disaffiliation. Forty-three churches had requested to leave the Conference, part of a significant movement that has been brewing for years across the national and global stage. That situation is an article in itself, although it may be enough to know, for today, that any church division comes with no small amount of grief and sorrow.

On Saturday, I sat with the UMC as their business continued. I listened and bore witness from the back of the plenary hall, and in the hallways, and at our display table. Holy conversations happen in many places. I was able to tell people that my purpose there was accompaniment; the reminder that they were not alone. Visiting wider church meetings is a kind of chaplaincy. When WCC staff join you, we are there in a spirit of love, on behalf of a wider community.

Midafternoon, it was time for me to come to the podium. Before hundreds of United Methodists, I was able to share words of assurance. From my ecumenical visits, I could say with confidence that this part of the body was seen, known, and loved. It was not alone in its distress. All around the church, people were bearing witness to this time, and accompanying the UMC in prayer. Just as the Wisconsin Annual Conference of the UMC was in session to consider disaffiliations, the Wisconsin Conference of the UCC was in plenary praying for them. This is the power of ecumenism, and ecumenical prayer. We are not alone.

Hearing this brought the audience to tears. This is the simple grace-filled truth of being held by another when we are struggling, of not needing to ask for it, but having it offered freely.

Remember your neighbors. Invite prayer for them. Ask what is going on in their ministry that can use a bit of prayer this week, and add it to your petitions or concerns. This is the church turned outward, connecting, remembering that we are all part of one body, being held in grace, and practicing a grace-filled response.

Your prayer matters. I know this to be true.
